SHOULD YOU WISH TO RE-SQUAD

Once a shooter has officially squadded, a series of events takes place: shooter entry sheets are printed; data that is needed for the ASTF, ATA, & Remington is loaded into a computer; and labels, squad sheets, & the official scoreboard sheets get printed & distributed. Any squadding change means several folks have to re-do quite a bit of work. Because we are trying to provide the fastest and most accurate shooting records possible, any squad changes after you have been officially squadded will be met with a \$20 re-squad fee per occurance, no exceptions.

NOTE: Shooters tied in HANDICAP events may elect to carry over their ties but ONLY if shoot management & ALL shooters involved agree to this.

CLASSIFICATION

Shooters are required to have both their 16-yard & Doubles averages for the current year. The Handicap Committee will classify shooters based on known ability and the following:

Singles

Class AA - 97% and over

Class A --- 94% and under 97%

Class B --- 91% and under 94%

Class C --- 88% and under 91%

Class D --- Under 88%

Doubles

Class AA - 93% and over

Class A --- 89% and under 93%

Class B --- 85% and under 89%

Class C --- 78% and under 85%

Class D --- Under 78%

Shooters with the following registered target totals during the current and previous 2 years will be classified by the Handicap Committee as below:

Less than 1,000 16 yard targets - Class B or higher Less than 500 Doubles targets - Class B or higher

Assigned yardage applies during this shoot. Shooters with less than 1,000 Handicap targets registered in the current and previous 2 years will be assigned penalty yardage as indicated below:

Penalty yardage for adult males is 23 yards. Penalty yardage for Ladies and Jrs. is 21 yards. Penalty yardage for Sub-Juniors is 20 yards.

PRE-SQUADDING

Those wishing to pre-squad for any or all events may do so through **PRESQUAD.COM**. Please go to their website & follow their easy instructions. For those without computers or internet service, please call ATA Delegate James Kiddy - 501-753-3317 - and he will do your pre-squadding for you through **PRESQUAD.COM**.

LUNCH & SNACKS

Lunch and snacks can be purchased on the grounds during the shoot at <u>Bubba's Southern Barbeque</u>.

TARGET SETTING

Targets will be set by members of the Target Setting Committee using radar guns each morning. Flights, angles, & height (ATA recommended height is 9 feet) will be in strict compliance with the ATA rule book. Illegal targets (more than 10 degrees outside normal parameters) or targets that vary appreciably from trap to trap may be reset but only by members of the Target Setting Committee, ASTF Officials, or Shoot Management. Any other shooter who goes beyond the 16 yard line, attempting to manipulate or alter the Pat traps belonging to Remington Arms will be immediately disqualified.

PRACTICE TRAPS

Fields 5 thru 9 will be available each morning for practice rounds approximately one hour ahead of the starting time for each day's scheduled events - 8:00 a.m on Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and Sunday; 7:00 a.m. on Saturday.

WEDNESDAY'S TARGETS

Wednesday's State Shoot targets <u>are</u> registered, & ASTF trophies <u>will</u> be given. Preliminary class champions on Wednesday, however, will <u>not</u> be advanced. Class advances, the HOA, & all of the ATA All America Team point events will not start until <u>Thursday</u> (Event 4).

SATURDAY SUPPER

The ASTF is hosting the Saturday meal - free to shooters (tickets will be given when cashiering). Tickets or a \$5.00 payment for non-shooters are required at the collection point in order to receive your meal.

PROBLEMS OR GRIEVANCES

Should any problems occur, please contact Shoot Management or any ASTF Official, & we will do our best to resolve all problems as quickly as possible.

ZONE MEETINGS

Zone Meetings - Zone meetings will be held on Saturday, June 20th. The specific time & places will be posted on the scoreboard during the shoot.

100 PER FIELD

Shooters will shoot 100 targets per field & be able to choose their favorite <u>field</u> & <u>squad number</u>. As always, we will continue to rotate fields on the second 100 of the Championship Singles, but will try to squad you as close to your favorite field as possible for the 1st 100.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES

The use of motorized transportation vehicles by <u>non-shooters</u> will <u>not</u> be permitted on or near the shooting fields during State Shoot competition & shoot-offs. Bonafide shooters, shoot management, & shoot personnel will be permitted to use motorized transportation vehicles, provided they possess a valid driver's license and make every effort to minimize the use of these vehicles when possible during any actual shooting competition. NOTE: This policy does <u>not</u> apply to wheelchairs - wheelchairs (motorized or not) <u>will always</u> be permitted at <u>all</u> times on the grounds during the State Shoot.

SUNDAY MORNING CHURCH SERVICE

A non-denominational church service will be offered from 7:00 to 7:45 a.m. Sunday morning, June 20, 2010 at the permanent pavilion just west of the clubhouse. The ASTF Annual Meeting will follow this service - same location.

ARKANSAS SUB-JUNIORS

All Arkansas Sub-Junior shooters may shoot their state shoot targets for half price in all events. They must shoot targets only - no options.

AIM SHOOT

Our inaugural AIM shoot for youth shooters will be held on Tuesday, June 15, 2010 under the leadership of Petey Chambless, State AIM Director.

RULES

- 1. ATA rules will govern this shoot. It is the <u>shooter's</u> responsibility to know the ATA rules.
- Trophies will be awarded at the end of each day. Henry Carroll will be available for photos.
- 3. All options will be <u>OPEN</u>. Options will close when the first squad's scores are posted.
- 4. All Lady, JR, Sub-Jr, Vet, & SR Vet shooters must declare their special category at the time of classification in this shoot if they wish to compete as a category shooter. No contestant will be allowed to declare or change a special category declaration after firing their first shot.
- Sub-Junior any shooter under 15 years of age.
 Junior any shooter 15 to 18 years of age.
 Veteran any shooter 65 to 70 years of age.
 Sr. Veteran any shooter 70 years and older.

- 6. The state handicap champion automatically will earn at least 1 yard.
- 7. Eye and ear protection are mandatory.
- 8. Should you win or tie for high class in any 16-yard or Doubles event, or should you earn yardage in any Handicap event, it shall be your duty to report to the handicap table and have your classification or yardage reviewed. Any shooter whose class or yardage is changed for any reason, shall be considered to have been notified when the new class or yardage is posted on the bulletin board.
- 9. Any shooter failing to carry out rule 8 above, or who shoots in a class or on a yardage marked higher or lower than that which is marked on their card, will be subject to disqualification and will not be eligible to share in any money division or trophies.
- 10. Class winners in the preliminary Singles & Doubles events on Wednesday will <u>not</u> advance a class. Class winners in the Class Singles & Class Doubles events on Thursday <u>will</u> advance a class.
- 11. A shooter may not win more than one ATA or ASTF trophy in the same event. If a shooter's score qualifies for more than one trophy, the shooter must notify Shoot Management in the Remington clubhouse within 15 minutes of that event's last score being posted as to which trophy they desire to shoot-off for or to accept. Failure of the shooter to make proper notification imposes on Shoot Management the duty to make the declaration for the shooter. Shoot Management will follow ATA rules & guidelines in determining trophy winners.
- 12. Any shooter who ties for event Champion may shootoff/carry-over for the Championship trophy. If a shooter fails in the championship shootoff/carry-over, and has declared a special category at the time of classification, the shooter can fall back to the declared special category.
- 13. Any shooter who has declared a special category at the time of classification, and whose score qualifies for any trophy in his/her declared special category, will compete for the category trophy and <u>not</u> for place, class, or yardage group.
- 14. Any special category shooter whose score does not qualify for a trophy in his/her category, may compete for place, class, or yardage group trophies.

- 15. The offical score must be kept on a score sheet in plain view of the contestant. Any errors must be corrected before firing the first shot at the succeeding post, or in the case of the last post, before leaving the field.
- 16. A squad will not be held more than <u>3 MINUTES</u>. Shooters missing their squad will be re-squadded on a later squad for a \$20.00 penalty fee.
- 17. Shoot-off contestants will be given <u>3 CALLS</u>. If there is no response after this, the shooter will forfeit.
- 18. In the event of withdrawal, the entry fee will be refunded. Purse or option money will not be refunded. Each shooter who is entitled to receive money won during any event agrees that if such money is not received by them during the shoot, payment will be mailed to them by the ASTF.
- 19. Since the Remington Gun Club is our host club, only Remington shells will be available for sale. If you prefer other brands, please bring your own shells.
- 20. Shoot Management & ASTF Officials reserve the right at any time to change, alter, or modify this program in any manner deemed necessary.
- 21. Shoot Management & ASTF Officials reserve the right to refuse any entry & disqualify anyone who interferes with or disturbs the harmony of this shoot in any manner.

RUSSELL MARKS - BO SHAW FOUNDATION
