REGISTRATION & SQUADDING

Registration will begin Tuesday, June 17, at 2:00 p.m. in the Clubhouse. In the clubhouse, there will be three (3) separate registration lines: one each for Classification, Squadding, and Cashiering. Before entering the Classification line, shooters must have their complete and up-to-date ATA Average card ready to present, along with proof of current ASTF/state membership.

PRESQUAD opens April 28th

SHOOTERS ARE HIGHLY ENCOURAGED TO PRESQUAD FOR ANY/ALL EVENTS THROUGH SOSCLAYS.COM at the rate of \$2 per post. It is free if you have the premium SOS Clays membership.

FEES- Cash or check. Make checks payable to ASTF. ASTF will accept credit card payments with a 3% service fee.

IRS Regulations require a Social Security Number for accumulated winnings of \$600+ may be distributed by check.

RE-SQUAD FEE

Any shooter that chooses to re-squad for reasons of *convenience* or *weather* will be charged a \$20 re-squad fee, per occurrence. <u>No exceptions</u>.

PRACTICE / MAKE-UP

Field #1 will be utilized for Practice and Make-ups. Although there are no immediate plans, Management reserves the right to utilize Field #1 to help finish an event, if needed. Availability of fields for practice in the evening will be posted in the clubhouse.

SHOOT TIMES / PRACTICE

ALL EVENTS WILL BEGIN AT 8:00 a.m., EXCEPT FOR TUESDAY (AIM) AND SUNDAY, WHICH BEGIN AT 9:00 a.m. No shooting of any kind, on any day, prior to 8:00 a.m. PRACTICE TICKETS available in the Pro Shop.

HOA & HAA

HAA includes Events 9, 11, & 12: 400 targets. HOA includes Events 2-12: 1200 targets.

AR SINGLES CHAMPIONSHIP - 200 TARGETS

Fields will not be rotated on Saturday during the Arkansas Singles Championship (Event 11). The second 100 targets will be shot on the same field as the first 100 targets.

Alcohol

No open containers of alcoholic beverages allowed.

TROPHIES

The intent of the ASTF regarding the winning of trophies: Current ATA rules apply to all trophies. Thank you for your cooperation in picking-up trophies during the week and not all at once on Sunday when everyone is rushing to go home! Trophies will NOT be mailed; arrangements may be made to pick up another shooter's trophy; see Trophy Chairman. A schedule of times when trophies may be picked up will be posted.

TARGETS & TARGET SETTING

Targets will be <u>White Flyer All Orange targets</u>. Flight, angles, and height will be in strict compliance with the ATA rule book. <u>Background is a shot curtain</u>.

100 & 200 STRAIGHT PINS

Shooters breaking 100 or 200 straight targets, without carryover, will be awarded a 100 or 200 straight pin. One pin per lifetime. Please see cashier once the event is finalized.

ASTF ANNUAL MEETING

Sunday, June 22, 8:00 – 9:00 a.m., In the Tent

Everyone is encouraged to attend but only those meeting the following criteria will be eligible to vote. IMPORTANT VOTING CRITERIA:

Those and only those meeting the following criteria are allowed to vote. All residents who are both current ATA members (*paid 2025 ATA dues*), and ASTF life members, residing in the State of Arkansas, who are present in person at the meeting, and who have been active members registering targets in any two (2) target years, shall be entitled to vote.

ATA All American rings & Arkansas State Team awards will be presented. Group photos will be taken.

ZONE MEETINGS

Saturday, June 21 at 7:30 a.m. At this business meeting, All residents who are both current ATA members (*paid 2025 ATA dues*), and ASTF life members, residing in the State of Arkansas, who are present in person at the meeting, and who have been active members, registering targets in any two (2) target years, shall be entitled to vote.

Note: Shooters tied in Handicap events may elect to carry their ties only if shoot management and all shooters involved agree to carry over. This decision must be made before 3rd call.

SUNDAY MORNING CHURCH SERVICE

A non-denominational church service will start at 7:00 am Sunday morning in the tent.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES - A Permit is required.

All motorized transportation (excluding wheelchairs) must check in at the pro shop to obtain a permit. To **obtain a permit you must have a valid driver's license and proof of \$300,000 "Off Premises" Liability** insurance. The use of motorized transportation vehicles by non-shooters will not be permitted on or near the shooting fields during state shoot competition and shoot-offs. Bonafide shooters, shoot management, and shoot personnel will be permitted to use motorized transportation vehicles, provided they possess a permit, and make every effort to minimize the use of these vehicles when possible during any actual shooting competition. The policy does not apply to wheelchairs, motorized or not, which are always permitted on the grounds during the state shoot. **There will also be "Quiet Hours" this year from 10pm**-6am. No side by sides, golf carts, or utility vehicles can be in use during these hours.

SHOOT ANNOUNCEMENTS

CLASSIFICATION

Shooters are required to have both their 16-yard and Doubles averages for the current year. The Handicap Committee will classify shooters based on known ability and the following:

Shooters with the following registered target totals during the current and previous year will be classified as follows:

Less than 1,000 16-YARD targetsClass B or higherLess than 500 DOUBLES targetsClass B or higher

Assigned yardage applies during this shoot. Shooters with less than 1,000 total Handicap targets registered in the current and previous year will be assigned penalty yardage as indicated below.

Less than 1,000 HANDICAP targets .Adult males - 23 yards .Ladies and Juniors - 21 yards .Sub-Juniors - 20 yards Senior Veterans – Assessed NO penalty Yardage or Class

The Handicap Committee reserves the right to change the shooter's classification at any time.



Rules

1. ATA rules will govern this shoot. It is the shooter's responsibility to know the ATA rules.

2. Trophy pick-up times will be posted in the club house. Trophies will not be mailed. <u>Please pickup</u> trophies during the week.

3. All **options** will be open. Options will close when the first squads for the event are called to the line.

4. Special Categories

Lady I A Female shooter who has not rea	ched her 55th Birthday
Lady II A Female shooter who has reached	d her 55th Birthday
Sub-Junior A shooter who has not reached his	/her 15th Birthday
Junior A shooter who is 15 but has not rea	ached his/her 18th birthday
Junior Gold . A shooter who is 18 but has not rea	ached his/her 23rd birthday
Sub Veteran . A shooter who is 55 but not reache	d his/her 65th birthday
Veteran A shooter who is 65 but not reache	d his/her 70th birthday
Sr. Veteran A shooter who is 70 years of age a	nd older

Age based categories are established by the age of the shooter on the first day of the target year (Sept 1st)

5. Special categories must be **declared** at the time of Classification if he/she wishes to compete as a category shooter. Categories are: Lady I, Lady II, Sub-Junior, Junior, Junior Gold, Sub Vet, Veteran and Senior Vet. No contestant will be allowed to declare or change category after firing their first shot. Check your entry receipt!

6. Shooters may declare only **one (1) special category**. Note: Chair Shooters are exempt from this rule and will follow ATA trophy rules.

7. A shooter may not win more than **one ATA or ASTF trophy** in the same event. Exceptions to this rule are the special donated trophies such as the Hall of Fame Award. Shoot Management will follow ATA rules and guidelines in determining trophy winners.

8. Any shooter who is tied for event Champion may **shoot-off/carry-over** for the Championship trophy. If a shooter fails in the championship shoot-off/carry-over and has declared a special category at the time of classification, the shooter will fall back to the declared special category.

9. Any shooter who has declared a special category at the time of classification, and whose score qualifies/ties for any trophy in his/her declared special category, will compete for the category trophy and <u>not</u> for place, class, or yardage group.

10. Any special category shooter whose score does not qualify/tie for a trophy in his/her category, may compete for place, class, or yardage group trophies.

11. Should you win or tie for high class in any 16-yard or Doubles event, or should you earn yardage in any Handicap event, it shall be the **Shooters responsibility** to report to the handicap table and have their classification or yardage reviewed. Any shooter whose class or yardage is changed for any reason, shall be **considered to have been notified** when the new class or yardage is posted on the bulletin board.

12. Any shooter failing to carry out rule 11 above, or who shoots in a class or on a yardage marked higher or lower than that which is marked on their card, will be subject to disqualification and will not be eligible to share in any money division or trophies.

13. **Advances** - Winners in the preliminary Singles and Doubles events on Wednesday will <u>not</u> advance a class. High scores in each class in the Singles and Doubles events on Thursday and Friday <u>will</u> advance a class.

14. The State Handicap Champion automatically will earn at least 1 yard.

15. A squad will not be held more than <u>3 minutes</u>. Missed squad will only allow for 50 make up targets. Beyond that, shooters will be required to re-squad on a later squad for a \$20.00 Re-Squad fee. Late shooters will not be called.

16. Scoring - The official score sheet must always be available for shooter inspection, at all times. Any errors must be corrected before firing the first shot at the succeeding post, or in the case of the last post, before leaving the field. Any target marked "0" or any scored target not clearly marked with "/" or "X" or 0, or any scored target with both an "X" or "0" shall be scored as "LOST" by shoot management, unless the word "DEAD" is clearly printed beside it.

17. Shoot offs will begin immediately after the last event of the day. **Shoot-off contestants** will be given 3 calls, with 3 minutes of response time after each call. If a shooter does not check in after the three calls & the 9 minutes have elapsed, they will forfeit their shoot-off opportunity.

18. In the event of **withdrawal** for reasons of *convenience* or *weather*, entry fees, purse or option money will **not be refunded**. "Weather cancellation" is the only circumstance in which target and option refunds will be given. Any subevent target shot at will count toward a score.

19. No Shooter will be considered entered until entry is paid.

20. **Double check your Entry Sheet for accuracy** prior to shooting... Classification, Category, Class, Yardage, etc.

21. Each shooter who is entitled to receive money won during any event agrees that if such money is not received by them during the shoot, payment can be mailed to them by the ASTF. All added money & option money from Sunday's events will be mailed.

22. All Arkansas residents must provide proof of Arkansas State Trapshooting Federation (ASTF) Life membership.

23. Upon approaching the Classification desk, ALL shooters must present an up to date ATA Average card reflective of ALL scores shot & averages calculated. Submitting erroneous cards, or shooting from incorrect yardage (no matter how their card is marked), will result in disqualification, forfeiture of trophies, etc. Any violation will be reported to the ATA Executive Committee.

24. Eye and ear protection is mandatory.

25. Shoot Management & ASTF Officials reserve the right to change, alter, or modify this program in any manner deemed necessary.

26. Shoot Management & ASTF Officials reserve the right to refuse any entry & disqualify anyone who interferes with or disturbs the harmony of this shoot in any manner.

27. All decisions by the Shoot Management regarding the listed rules, or other disputes, shall be final. All decisions will be made in conformity with ATA rules, where applicable.

28. Only shooters competing on a field at that time, referees, scorers, or other shoot officials, may be on an active trap field during a registered shoot unless a safety or emergency concern arises.

29. Trapline supervisors may move squads to alternate fields to ensure all events are completed in a timely manner.

Jim McMahan

Jim grew up in east Tennessee and while he really enjoyed playing school sports his most enjoyable activity was hunting and would spend his free time with a shotgun walking the fields and hills. When Jim graduated from high school he joined the United States Navy and served honorably. His service enabled Jim to attended college on the GI bill. Jim had a lengthy career in the field of nuclear power. During Jim's career he was on a consulting agreement

with the Palo Verde Nuclear Station in Phoenix Arizona. This is when Jim was introduced to the sport of trapshooting. Jim registered his first ATA targets at the Phoenix gun club in 1986. At that first shoot Jim posted a 98 in singles and a 98 in the handicap and earned a one yard punch on his ATA application. He shot a 100 straight in singles in his second registered shoot at the Black Canyon Gun club and another 100 at his third registered shoot at the Phoenix gun club. Then Jim was hooked on trapshooting for the rest of his life. He has registered ATA targets every year since 1986. He has registered over a 200,000 targets to date and still shooting.

In 1989 Jim ran 200 straight in the Grand American in Ohio. In 2009 he shot a 100 straight in Doubles at the Grand American in Illinois. He continues his pursuit of the completion of the elusive Grand American Grand Slam. Also in 1989 Jim was the Southwest Zone Handicap Champion. He has won multiple trophies at the Grand American, the Mid West Grand American, Pre Autumn Grand and a trophy at the Southwestern Grand American. Jim has won numerous trophies at the following state championship tournaments: Arkansas, Arizona, Kansas, Louisiana, Mississippi, Missouri, Nebraska, Oklahoma, and Texas. Jim has been on the Arkansas State team 6 times. Jim served 2 years on the Arkansas Trapshooting Federation Board of Directors. He is a lifetime member of the ATA and ASTF. Jim is also a member of the 2025 Sr Vet ATA All American Team.

The thing that Jim has enjoyed the most about trapshooting is the friendships that he has established during the many years of competition shooting. He enjoys visiting with old friends at the shoots and catching up on their life experiences.



Renae Chambless Petey Chambless

Petey and Renae Chambless began their trapshooting journeys in 2007. Although their shooting slowed, they quickly started providing assistance at the local, state and national levels.

Renae was the one who introduced the family into the world of trapshooting. She started

shooting at Remington Gun Club to try and find a new hobby she could enjoy. Shortly after starting, she and Petey noticed a need and began helping run Blue Rock's ATA shoots. Petey installed two new trap fields at the club in 2008.

In 2007, Renae first started helping at the Grand American. She worked in the Event Center at the customer service desk. She was always quick to help anyone, especially kids and parents who had questions about the AIM program. After working in the Event Center for several years, Renae then began working in the "shootoff shack" in 2013, a job she still does to this day.

Also in 2007, the pair began helping at the Iowa State Shoot. Renae aided with their AIM program. Since 2019, Petey has worked as a trap mechanic at the shoot. They still make the same trip every year. Renae also assisted at the Kentucky State Shoot for three years.

Petey was asked in 2008 to help set targets at that year's Grand American. The next year, he was promoted to trap mechanic. In 2013 he took over as the Trap/Target Setting Manager, a job he still does every year.

The duo helped host the first AIM shoot in the state of Arkansas in 2009. The shoot took place at Remington Gun Club. Petey said that so many kids signed up, the line stretched from inside the clubhouse all the way to Field 9.

The pair were also AIM and AYSSP coaches for several years. Their team ,"Team NITRO," won the 2012 senior division. They also served as AIM Directors for Arkansas for more than nine years. Renae was named as the AIM National Advisor for 10 years from 2013-2023.

Petey has worked on trap machines at every club in Arkansas that throw registered targets, and even some that no longer do. He has worked on trap machines in nine different states, with several others asking for his help. Petey takes pride in throwing the best target he can at whatever club he goes to.

Petey has worked at the classification desk at the Arkansas State Shoot for more than 10 years.

Renae was named interim-secretary of the Arkansas State Trapshooting Federation during the 2008 target year. She was elected to the position in 2009 and served for 10 years. She was then ASTF president for three years from 2021 to 2023.

The Chambless family always makes sure to place an ad in the Arkansas state program book.

Petey and Renae were married in 1993. They moved to Lonoke in 1995 and still live there today.

Petey has worked as a construction engineer for 32 years, while Renae worked for Alltel Telephone Company for 27 and retired in 2017.

Outside of helping with shoots, the couple enjoys hunting and spending time with their son, J.K., and daughter-in-law, Tori.

Petey said the thing they love the most about the ATA is the friends they have made from all over the world. He added that every shoot they go to is like a family reunion.





Sam Weaver

Since starting in ATA in 2005 at the age of 63, Sam Weaver has registered over 47,000 singles, 39,000 handicap, and 30,000 doubles targets.

Sam began shooting league at the St. Charles (IL) Gun Club in the late 1990s. Out of 50 teams competing, Sam and his team would finish around second place each year. After years of shooting together, one teammate suggested Sam should join the ATA because "it will make you a better shooter." Sam responded, "Sign me up!" He laughs about the decision now because it did not improve his shooting and has cost him a small fortune.

In August of 2005, Sam broke 95 in the singles during an ATA at the Downers Grove (IL) Sportsmen's Club and took home the D Class award. A few months later, Sam moved to Arkansas and by 2006, he began shooting at the Bella Vista Sportsmen's Club. He served as club president from 2007-2015. "I had the greatest people helping me," he said, including Eddy Kinslow, Craig Seckington, Debbie Hall, and Paula and Dennis Rasmussen. Under his leadership, Sam and his team improved the club's finances tenfold, allowing for larger payouts at ATA shoots and making club improvements, including computerizing services.

Perhaps Sam's most valuable accomplishment as president has been growing the number of youth shooters participating in the AYSSP program. With the club regularly hosting AIM shoots, Sam would encourage young people to shoot in ATA events. Because of his influence, more and more youth are continuously taking part in club events.

Eddy Kinslow commends Sam for his ability to recollect details about other shooters. "Because he pays attention to how you shoot and listens to what you have to say, he is a constant source of encouragement. He continues to bring new shooters into our club. When he meets them and the youth shooters' parents, he talks to them. Sam will call them by name the next time he sees them. His encouragement endures." Sam's support has not been limited to Bella Vista. He has contributed to the Arkansas State Shoot and the Grand American. He has spent years supporting ASTF by assisting Eddy Kinslow in preparing the ASTF program and consistently purchasing an ad for the program. Every Saturday during the Grand American Handicap, Sam volunteers as a referee for shootoffs. In 2023, he refereed Ricky Merriman, who won the Grand American Handicap. He can also be seen relieving scorers during state and local shoots when they need a break.

Through the years, Sam has had some stand-out wins. In 2014, he won senior veteran during the Singles Championship of the Arkansas State Shoot, which allowed him to compete at the Champion of Champions competition at the Grand American. At the Arkansas State Shoot in 2024, he bested every in-state shooter during the Remington Handicap with a score of 97. Afterward, several older people congratulated him on the accomplishment. For a senior veteran to win like that, Sam said it was "something special." He also boasts several trophies from the Grand American. "I'm very proud of them," Sam said.

Sam is a certified NRA Shotgun Instructor. He's a two-time veteran and three-time senior veteran member of the Arkansas State Team. Sam loves having his picture taken with the state team. "All of them are great shooters. There's nothing like standing up there with folks who know what they're doing," Sam said.

Before shooting became a prominent endeavor, Sam spent nearly 30 years working for The Quaker Oats Company. He retired in 2001 as the Director of Grain Research and Development. Now, at 82, Sam's goal is to continue shooting as long as he can.

Sam acknowledges all the friends he has made over the years and wants to give special thanks to Gary Phipps, his mentor. "Winning trophies is not the most important part of trap shootintg. The nice and interesting people you meet and the friends you make along the way are the most valuable part of this sport", Sam said. He also wants to thank his wife, Carolan, for her unwavering support.


