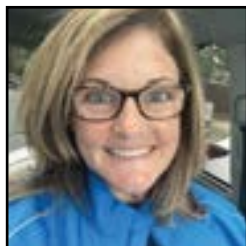

NOTICES

REGISTRATION & SQUADDING

Registration will begin Tuesday, June 23, at 2:00 p.m. in the Clubhouse. In the clubhouse, there will be three (3) separate registration lines: one each for Classification, Squadding, and Cashiering. Before entering the Classification line, shooters must have their complete and up-to-date ATA Average card ready to present, along with proof of current ASTF/state membership.

PRESQUAD opens April 28th

SHOOTERS ARE HIGHLY ENCOURAGED TO PRESQUAD FOR ANY/ALL EVENTS THROUGH SOSCLAYS.COM at the rate of \$2 per post. It is free if you have the premium SOS Clays membership.

FEES- Cash or check. Make checks payable to ASTF. ASTF will accept credit card payments with a 3% service fee.

IRS Regulations require a Social Security Number for accumulated winnings of \$600+ may be distributed by check.

RE-SQUAD FEE

Any shooter that chooses to re-squad for reasons of convenience or weather will be charged a \$20 re-squad fee, per occurrence. No exceptions.

PRACTICE / MAKE-UP

Field #1 will be utilized for Practice and Make-ups. Although there are no immediate plans, Management reserves the right to utilize Field #1 to help finish an event, if needed. Availability of fields for practice in the evening will be posted in the clubhouse.

SHOOT TIMES / PRACTICE

ALL EVENTS WILL BEGIN AT 8:00 a.m., EXCEPT FOR TUESDAY (AIM) AND SUNDAY, WHICH BEGIN AT 9:00 a.m. No shooting of any kind, on any day, prior to 8:00 a.m. PRACTICE TICKETS available in the Pro Shop.

HOA & HAA

HAA includes Events 9, 11, & 12: 400 targets. HOA includes Events 2-12: 1200 targets.

AR SINGLES CHAMPIONSHIP - 200 TARGETS

Fields will not be rotated on Saturday during the Arkansas Singles Championship (Event 11). The second 100 targets will be shot on the same field as the first 100 targets.

ALCOHOL

No open containers of alcoholic beverages allowed.

TROPHIES

The intent of the ASTF regarding the winning of trophies: Current ATA rules apply to all trophies. Thank you for your cooperation in picking-up trophies during the week and not all at once on Sunday when everyone is rushing to go home! Trophies will NOT be mailed; arrangements may be made to pick up another shooter's trophy; see Trophy Chairman. A schedule of times when trophies may be picked up will be posted.

TARGETS & TARGET SETTING

Targets will be White Flyer All Orange targets. Flight, angles, and height will be in strict compliance with the ATA rule book. Background is a shot curtain.

100 & 200 STRAIGHT PINS

Shooters breaking 100 or 200 straight targets, without carryover, will be awarded a 100 or 200 straight pin. One pin per lifetime. Please see cashier once the event is finalized.

ASTF ANNUAL MEETING

Sunday, June 28, 8:00 – 9:00 a.m., In the Tent

Everyone is encouraged to attend but only those meeting the following criteria will be eligible to vote.

IMPORTANT VOTING CRITERIA:

Those and only those meeting the following criteria are allowed to vote. All residents who are both current ATA members (paid 2026 ATA dues), and ASTF life members, residing in the State of Arkansas, who are present in person at the meeting, and who have been active members registering targets in any two (2) target years, shall be entitled to vote.

ATA All American rings & Arkansas State Team awards will be presented. Group photos will be taken.

ZONE MEETINGS

Saturday, June 22 at 7:30 a.m. At this business meeting, All residents who are both current ATA members (paid 2026 ATA dues), and ASTF life members, residing in the State of Arkansas, who are present in person at the meeting, and who have been active members, registering targets in any two (2) target years, shall be entitled to vote.

SUNDAY MORNING CHURCH SERVICE

A non-denominational church service will start at 7:00 am Sunday morning in the tent.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES - A Permit is required.

All motorized transportation (excluding wheelchairs) must check in at the pro shop to obtain a permit. **To obtain a permit you must have a valid driver's license and proof of \$300,000 "Off Premises" Liability insurance.** The use of motorized transportation vehicles by non-shooters will not be permitted on or near the shooting fields during state shoot competition and shoot-offs. Bonafide shooters, shoot management, and shoot personnel will be permitted to use motorized transportation vehicles, provided they possess a permit, and make every effort to minimize the use of these vehicles when possible during any actual shooting competition. The policy does not apply to wheelchairs, motorized or not, which are always permitted on the grounds during the state shoot. **There will also be "Quiet Hours" this year from 10pm-6am. No side by sides, golf carts, or utility vehicles can be in use during these hours.**

SHOOT ANNOUNCEMENTS

CLASSIFICATION

Shooters are required to have both their 16-yard and Doubles averages for the current year. The Handicap Committee will classify shooters based on known ability and the following:

Shooters with the following registered target totals during the current and previous year will be classified as follows:

- Less than 1,000 16-YARD targets** **Class B or higher**
- Less than 500 DOUBLES targets** **Class B or higher**

Assigned yardage applies during this shoot. Shooters with less than 1,000 total Handicap targets registered in the current and previous year will be assigned penalty yardage as indicated below.

- Less than 1,000 HANDICAP targets**
- Adult males - 23 yards**
- Ladies and Juniors - 21 yards**
- Sub-Juniors - 20 yards**
- Senior Veterans – Assessed NO penalty Yardage or Class**

The Handicap Committee reserves the right to change the shooter's classification at any time.

RULES

1. ATA rules will govern this shoot. It is the shooter's responsibility to know the ATA rules.
2. **Trophy pick-up** times will be posted in the club house. Trophies will not be mailed. Please pickup trophies during the week.
3. All **options** will be open. Options will close when the first squads for the event are called to the line.
4. **Special Categories**

Lady I	A Female shooter who has not reached her 55th Birthday
Lady II	A Female shooter who has reached her 55th Birthday
Sub-Junior	A shooter who has not reached his/her 15th Birthday
Junior	A shooter who is 15 but has not reached his/her 18th birthday
Junior Gold	A shooter who is 18 but has not reached his/her 23rd birthday
Sub Veteran	A shooter who is 55 but not reached his/her 65th birthday
Veteran	A shooter who is 65 but not reached his/her 70th birthday
Sr. Veteran	A shooter who is 70 years of age and older

Age based categories are established by the age of the shooter on the first day of the target year (Sept 1st)
5. Special categories must be **declared** at the time of Classification if he/she wishes to compete as a category shooter. Categories are: Lady I, Lady II, Sub-Junior, Junior, Junior Gold, Sub Vet, Veteran and Senior Vet. No contestant will be allowed to declare or change category after firing their first shot. Check your entry receipt!
6. Shooters may declare only **one (1) special category**. Note: Chair Shooters are exempt from this rule and will follow ATA trophy rules.
7. A shooter may not win more than one **ATA or ASTF trophy** in the same event. Exceptions to this rule are the special donated trophies such as the Hall of Fame Award. Shoot Management will follow ATA rules and guidelines in determining trophy winners.
8. Any shooter who is tied for event Champion may **shoot-off/carry-over** for the Championship trophy. If a shooter fails in the championship shoot-off/carry-over and has declared a special category at the time of classification, the shooter will fall back to the declared special category.
9. Any shooter who has declared a special category at the time of classification, and whose score qualifies/ties for any trophy in his/her declared special category, will compete for the category trophy and *not* for place, class, or yardage group.
10. Any special category shooter whose score does not qualify/tie for a trophy in his/her category, may compete for place, class, or yardage group trophies.
11. Should you win or tie for high class in any 16-yard or Doubles event, or should you earn yardage in any Handicap event, it shall be the Shooters responsibility to report to the handicap table and have their classification or yardage reviewed. Any shooter whose class or yardage is changed for any reason, shall be considered to have been notified when the new class or yardage is posted on the bulletin board.
12. Any shooter failing to carry out rule 11 above, or who shoots in a class or on a yardage marked higher or lower than that which is marked on their card, will be subject to disqualification and will not be eligible to share in any money division or trophies.
13. **Advances** - Winners in the preliminary Singles and Doubles events on Wednesday will not advance a class. High scores in each class in the Singles and Doubles events on Thursday and Friday will advance a class.

RULES

14. The State Handicap Champion automatically will earn at least 1 yard.
15. A squad will not be held more than 3 minutes. Missed squad will only allow for 50 make up targets. Beyond that, shooters will be required to re-squad on a later squad for a \$20.00 Re-Squad fee. Late shooters will not be called.
16. **Scoring** - The official score sheet must always be available for shooter inspection, at all times. Any errors must be corrected before firing the first shot at the succeeding post, or in the case of the last post, before leaving the field. Any target marked "0" or any scored target not clearly marked with "P" or "X" or 0, or any scored target with both an "X" or "0" shall be scored as "LOST" by shoot management, unless the word "DEAD" is clearly printed beside it.
17. **Shoot offs** will begin immediately after the last event of the day. Shoot-off contestants will be given 3 calls, with 3 minutes of response time after each call. If a shooter does not check in after the three calls & the 9 minutes have elapsed, they will forfeit their shoot-off opportunity.
18. In the event of withdrawal for reasons of convenience or weather, entry fees, purse or option money will not be refunded. "Weather cancellation" is the only circumstance in which target and option refunds will be given. Any subevent target shot at will count toward a score.
19. No Shooter will be considered entered until entry is paid.
20. Double check your Entry Sheet for accuracy prior to shooting... Classification, Category, Class, Yardage, etc.
21. Each shooter who is entitled to receive money won during any event agrees that if such money is not received by them during the shoot, payment can be mailed to them by the ASTF. All added money & option money from Sunday's events will be mailed.
22. All Arkansas residents must provide proof of Arkansas State Trapshooting Federation (ASTF) Life membership.
23. Upon approaching the Classification desk, ALL shooters must present an up to date ATA Average card reflective of ALL scores shot & averages calculated. Submitting erroneous cards, or shooting from incorrect yardage (no matter how their card is marked), will result in disqualification, forfeiture of trophies, etc. Any violation will be reported to the ATA Executive Committee.
24. Eye and ear protection is mandatory.
25. Shoot Management & ASTF Officials reserve the right to change, alter, or modify this program in any manner deemed necessary.
26. Shoot Management & ASTF Officials reserve the right to refuse any entry & disqualify anyone who interferes with or disturbs the harmony of this shoot in any manner.
27. All decisions by the Shoot Management regarding the listed rules, or other disputes, shall be final. All decisions will be made in conformity with ATA rules, where applicable.
28. Only shooters competing on a field at that time, referees, scorers, or other shoot officials, may be on an active trap field during a registered shoot unless a safety or emergency concern arises.
29. Trapline supervisors may move squads to alternate fields to ensure all events are completed in a timely manner.

Roye Albritton



Roye Albritton

Roye Albritton was raised in Northern Louisiana in the early '50s. A farm child, he was introduced to shooting at an early age via a BB gun at the age of 7. By the age of 11, Roye got his first shotgun—a single-shot .410. “My twin brother had a 20-gauge, and my oldest brother had a pump shotgun.” With a distinct disadvantage, Roye quickly learned how to hold shells between his fingers and lips to stay competitive with his brothers. In the hills and creek bottoms of Union Parish, Louisiana, Roye hunted squirrels, deer, doves, and quail with his brothers.

The Albritton family never went hungry.

At the age of 16, Roye and his brothers began hosting “Barn Yard Shoots” using tripod trap throwers. After holding several successful tournaments, the shoots were postponed indefinitely after two of Roye’s father’s calves became sick from eating clay targets. Aside from a few rounds of skeet at Toby Bancroft Memorial Gun Club (formerly Pine Hills Gun Club), Roye’s clay target shooting remained very limited through the early 1980s.

In 1987, Roye’s career led him to Northwest Arkansas, where he began working for Walmart within their Information Systems Division. By 1992, Roye had joined the Bella Vista Sportsmen’s Club (BVSC) and began shooting skeet and trap. Over the next 26 years, Roye held nearly every position within the BVSC Board of Directors, including President, Vice President, Director, Secretary and Treasurer.

By 1995, Roye began registering ATA targets. His first shoot was at Oil Capital Gun Club in Coweta, OK—a location that remains one of his favorite places to shoot. At his first registered shoot, Roye broke 89 targets in singles and 90 in handicap. The 89 won Class C—a trap shooter was born.

Over the next 30 years, Roye competed in shoots across seven states and attended 28 Arkansas State Trap Shoots. To date, he has registered 58,650 singles, 44,150 handicap, and 32,800 doubles.

Among the personal highlights of his career, Roye notes:

- 2000 Arkansas Handicap Championship (Score: 94): This one is especially memorable due to Larry Hicks. After finishing, Roye began loading his truck, getting ready for the drive home. After telling Larry he shot a 94, and Larry quipping, “I would be staying around if I was you,” Roye stuck around. On the last flight for that event, another 94 was shot. “I won the event in a 3-round shoot-off.”
- 2007 AR B Class Singles Champion (199/200): This one is special to me because I bargained with James Kiddy at classification on where to place me. “Kiddy was bound to put me in B Class.” My average card clearly reflected a D Class average. As a compromise, I was put in C Class. Roye states that he was threatened not to “go out and shoot a good score.” I shot a 98 in a preliminary singles event and won C Class. I was advanced to B Class for the Singles Championship, where I posted the 199. A follow-up meeting with then-president Mike Tucker verified that no options were played and no added money was won—Roye was vindicated. “Needless to say, it was a good day.”
- 2017: Roye won Veteran Handicap Champion over several of his personal friends.
- 2018: Roye earned a placement on the Arkansas State Trap Team.

When asked what he considers his biggest trap accomplishments, Roye is quick to mention his time on the BVSC Board of Directors. His working with the Bella Vista Property Owners Association, to improve the shooting range facilities and allow for registered ATA shoots.

In 1995, Roye as vice president of the BVSC, submitted a joint venture proposal to the BV POA. In this proposal the BV Sportsmen’s Club would pay ½ the cost of a trap machine if the BV POA would agree to build a second trap field. The POA agreed and the 2nd Trap field was built. This allowed the Club to host ATA shoots.

In 1998 Roye as president of the BVSC, submitted a joint venture proposal to the BV POA. In this proposal The BV Sportsmen’s Club would pay the full cost of a trap machine if the BV POA would agree to build a third trap field. The POA agreed and the 3rd Trap field was built. This allowed the Club to host more shooters and increased revenue for the Club and the POA

Further improvements followed, including BVSC providing the labor to enclosing the Club house. Roye obtained a donation of a heating and air condition system installed in the Club house. This allowed for shooting during the winter months.

Roye was a key voice approving the BVSC paying to acquire shooter pavilions with picnic tables, fans, gun racks, and voice-activated target systems.

Roye would often stay in the trap houses, to load the trap machines during ATA shoots, so that the club could finish a 3 event shoot before dark.

In his early years on the BVSC Board, Roye would prepare quarterly newsletters to include New Member Recognition and membership wins at the local ATA shoots. Roye also managed the Club’s Skeet and Trap leagues spending many hours at the clubhouse on a Sunday Afternoon computing league handicaps and scores.

Roye on several occasions worked with local Boy Scout Chapters to host Trap shoots. In these shoots, the Scouts could earn their shotgun badge. Roye would give gun safety and basic shotgun shooting instructions to the Scouts. Roye notes that his shooting mentors were Carrol Crisler, Gary Phipps, Benny Holtzclaw, and Chuck Sharp. "I have never considered myself a good trap shooter, but I just had a couple of lucky days in my 30 years of shooting." He has made many friends in his 30 years of shooting trap—too many to mention by name. However, he does highlight Caleb Coody, who was new to the area and sent Roye an email asking about going shooting skeet or sporting clays sometime. Roye replied, "I did not have time to break in a new shooter." Shortly thereafter, he met Caleb, and they became good friends. Roye coached him, instructed him on trap shooting fundamentals, and gave pointers on singles and handicap disciplines. Finally, the support of his wife played a big part in Roye's trap career. His wife, Donna, was highly encouraging and supported him in pursuing his shooting interests. She often asks, "Don't you have a trap shoot that you can go to this weekend?"



Austin Scrogin

Austin's trapshooting began in Corning, Arkansas while shooting for the Corning Trap Team. He was 12 years old when he picked up a trap gun and hardly set it down. Trapshooting became a passion that inspired others around him. He was dedicated and possessed remarkable skills for the sport. His first professional lesson was given to him by the late Leo Harrison. Leo taught him a lot of the fundamentals that he continued to improve throughout his shooting career.

Austin was a 5-time ATA All American and was on the Arkansas State Team from 2013 through 2017. He had a career total ATA targets of 34,850 singles 31,350 Handicap and 25,050 doubles. He earned many trophies over the years from local shoots to state shoots, satellite grands and the Grand American. At age 14 he ran 4 consecutive 100's in doubles at the Grand American and in 2016 he was the youngest to ever run 5 consecutive 100's in doubles at the Grand American. Austin continued his trapshooting career when he went off to college to Doane University in Crete, Nebraska. He played football for the college but thrived on the Doane Shooting Team. The team went on to the Collegiate National competition and left as National Champions.

The life on the road as a trapshooter looks different for each person. For Austin it was family time. He shot alongside his brother Garrett for many years both competing against one another but foremost encouraging and supporting each other. In 2016 they shot at the Grand American in singles and won the Singles Class Champs for the Brother & Brother shoot by shooting 397 out of 400. As adulthood set in, Austin fulfilled his love for flying and became a cropduster. He wasn't trapshooting much anymore but took this time to watch his younger brother Christopher strive to become a great trapshooter too. Brothers shooting with brothers is hard to beat.

May this honor stand as a lasting tribute to a life well-lived.
